



List of Individuals Recognised as Political Prisoners by MEMORIAL Human Rights Centre

and Persecuted in connection with the Realisation of Their Right to Freedom of Religion





We consider political prisoners to be individuals who are serving a prison sentence, as well as those being held in custody or under house arrest as a form of pre-trial detention.

We reckon among political prisoners individuals who are being persecuted in connection with the realisation of their legitimate rights as well as those who are being unlawfully or disproportionately persecuted by the authorities for political reasons. We do not regard as political prisoners those individuals who used violence against the person or called for violence on the grounds of religion, nationality, race etc. All the criteria for considering individuals as political prisoners are <u>published</u> on our website.

As individuals persecuted in connection with the realisation of the right to freedom of religion make up more than a half of the total number of political prisoners in Russia, and as their cases of persecution have much in common, their names are compiled in a separate list. None of the individuals on the list used violence, called for violence or planned violent acts.

There are 297 names in the present list.

Now, it contains almost exclusively the names of Muslims, a majority of whom have been accused of participating in the organisation of Hizb ut-Tahrir al-Islami, as well as followers of Turkish theologian Bediüzzaman Said Nursî, who have been accused of participating in the inexistent organisation of Nurdjular. Jehovah's Witnesses have become another target of persecutions for religious reasons after their organisations were groundlessly labelled extremist and banned in Russia in 2017.

Among the political prisoners are 191 individuals accused of membership in the banned organisation of Hizb ut-Tahrir and 78 believers prosecuted for their participation in communities of Jehovah's Witnesses.

This list is far from being complete. It includes only those individuals and cases for which we have managed to collect and analyse sufficient information for a

convincing conclusion to be drawn about a politically motivated and illegal nature of the criminal prosecution. At the present time the list does not contain the names of a large number of people who have been deprived of liberty, and whose prosecution contains indications of illegality or political motivation, but for whose cases we have either not yet received the required information, or have not yet fully analysed the information. The whole list of those being persecuted on similar grounds is, as a minimum, three to four times as lengthy as the present one.

The necessity to provide a propagandist justification for the actuality of the terrorist threat and the need to demonstrate results in the 'fight against international terrorism'; the desire to suppress independent groups (not only religious ones) despite the illusiveness of their real threat to society and the corporate interests of law-enforcement bodies who strive to improve their performance on paper should be named as the main reasons for repressions against the Muslims whose names have been included on the list. Some cases, for instance, those of human rights defenders Rustem Latypov and Emir-Usein Kuku and activist Linar Vakhitov, can also be prompted by the desire to discontinue their lawful activity.

We should also highlight the criminal prosecution of the residents of Crimea on charges of their membership of Hizb ut-Tahrir: currently, there are 60 names on the list. It should be noted that as this organisation acts legally in Ukraine, the persecution of its members in Crimea becomes another tool of pressure on the Crimean Tatars.

A few years ago, people accused of membership of Hizb ut-Tahrir that had been groundlessly recognised as a terrorist organisation in Russia, were charged under an Article of the Russian Criminal Code envisaging up to 3 years of imprisonment for participation in the activities of an extremist organisation. Today, the toughening of legislation and law enforcement practices has led to the situation when, in most

cases, such people were charged under the new Article of the Criminal Code 'Organisation of the activities of a terrorist organisation and participation in the activities of such organisation', providing for a punishment up to life imprisonment, in conjunction with charges of preparation for a violent seizure of power, an Article providing for up to 10 years in prison. Terms of imprisonment imposed by the courts have also been lengthened (up to 24 (!) years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony). Particular aspects of the criminal prosecution of Muslims for membership in Hizb ut-Tahrir al-Islami are covered in a report compiled by the Programme for the support of political prisoners of Memorial Human Rights Centre in 2018.

We believe that the number of political prisoners on this list will surge in the near future as the persecution of Jehovah's Witnesses in Russia has significantly intensified since spring 2018. All over the Russian Federation, dozens of Jehovah's Witnesses have suffered searches and arrests; many of them have become defendants in criminal cases and placed in custody. 12 believers have already been sentenced to deprivation of liberty.

A 2020 <u>report</u> compiled by the Programme for the support of political prisoners of Memorial Human Rights Centre outlines the whole picture of politically motivated prosecution in Russia in 2018 - 2019.

Individuals persecuted in connection with the activities of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra

- 1. Akhtakhanov, Tagir Tapayevich, was born on 1 March 1980. A resident of the village of Achkhoi-Martan of the Achkhoi-Martan district of Chechnya. He is single and completed secondary education. He was sentenced to 11 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group'), Article 223, Part 3 ('Manufacturing of arms by an organised group') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. Mr. Akhtakhanov has been held in custody since 27 November 2013.
- 2. Balakadashev, Inyal Ibragimovich, was born on 12 August 1987. Legally, a resident of the village of Kaladzhukh of the Dokuzpar district of the Republic of Dagestan, he actually lived in the city of Petropavlovsk-Kamchatsky in Kamchatsky Krai. He is married and completed secondary education. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a sailor. He was sentenced to 11 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. Mr. Balakadashev has been held in custody since 27 November 2013.
- Balakadashev, Nurmagomed Ibragimovich, was born on 8 July 1983. Legally, a resident of the village of Kaladzhukh of the Dokuzpar district of the Republic of Dagestan, he actually lived in the city of Moscow. He is married with a child and completed secondary education. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a shipping agent. He was sentenced to 11 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow

"Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. Mr. Balakadashev has been held in custody since 27 November 2013.

- 4. Cheprasov, Sergei Sergeyevich, was born on 10 June 1990. Legally, a resident of the village of Sukhaya Olshanka of the Chernyanka district of Belgorod Oblast, he lived in the city of Moscow. He is single and completed professionalised secondary education. He was sentenced to 11 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. Mr. Cheprasov has been held in custody since 27 November 2013.
- 5. Esmurzayev, Khoso Gashimovich, was born on 27 August 1976. Legally, a resident of the village of Zyazikov-Yurt of the Maglobek district of Ingushetia, he lived in the city of Moscow. He completed secondary education and is single. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a taxi driver. He was sentenced to 11 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. Mr. Esmurzayev has been held in custody since 27 November 2013.
- 6. Fataliev, Shamil Kamilyevich, was born on 1 October 1968. A resident of the city of Saint Petersburg. He completed a specialised secondary education. He has two underage children. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a carpenter and a fitter. He was sentenced to 7 years of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of an extremist organisation') for his alleged membership of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. He has been held in custody since 24 May 2017.
- **7.** <u>Kubatov, Gazybek Adakhamovich,</u> was born on 23 March 1979. A resident of the city of Moscow, he is married with four children. He is a Kyrgyzstani citisen. He completed secondary education. He was sentenced to 4 years of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony under Article 282.2, Part 2

- ('Participation in the activities of an extremist organisation') as an alleged member of the banned Islamic movement of Tablighi Jamaat. He has been held in custody since 22 December 2016.
- **Makhmudov**, **Tazhib Taimirovich**, was born on 4 May 1982. A resident of the city of Moscow. He completed secondary education and is married with two children. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a driver. He was sentenced to 13 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group'), Article 223, Part 3 ('Manufacturing of arms by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 1 ('Storage of arms') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. Mr. Makhmudov has been held in custody since 27 November 2013.
- **9.** Nasimova, Matlyuba Islomovna, was born on 30 July 1960. Legally, a resident of the city of Samarqand of the Republic of Uzbekistan and an Uzbekistani national, she lived in the city of Moscow. She holds an incomplete higher education degree from the Samarqand University. She is married with eight children, two of them being underage. Prior to her arrest, she worked as a housemaid and sublet places in a flat that she rented. She was sentenced to 11 years of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group'), Article 223, Part 3 ('Manufacturing of arms by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 1 ('Storage of arms') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. Mrs. Nasimova has been held in custody since 27 November 2013.
- 10. Omarov, Bagavudin Rasulovich, was born on 27 March 1972. A resident of the city of Makhachkala in the Republic of Dagestan, he completed secondary specialised education. He is married with three children. He was charged under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of an extremist organisation') for his alleged membership of the banned organisation of AtTakfir wa al-Hijra. He has been held in custody since 1 November 2018.
- **11.** Ramazanov, Islam Magamedkerimovich, was born on 24 September. Legally, a resident of the city of Derbent in Dagestan, he lived in Moscow. He completed secondary education and is single. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a driver. He was sentenced to 11 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2,

Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group'), Article 223, Part 3 ('Manufacturing of arms by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 1 ('Storage of arms') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. He was sentenced to 11 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group'), Article 223, Part 3 ('Manufacturing of arms by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 1 ('Storage of arms') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. Mr. Saraliyev has been held in custody since 8 December 2013.
- **13.** Shavkhalov, Adam Akhmedovich, was born on 3 April 1981. Legally, a resident of the village of Zyazikov-Yurt of the Maglobek district of Ingushetia, he lived in the city of Moscow. He was sentenced to 11 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group'), Article 223, Part 3 ('Manufacturing of arms by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 1 ('Storage of arms') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of AtTakfir wa al-Hijra. - organised group'), Article 222, Part 1 ('Storage of arms') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. He was sentenced to 11 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group'), Article 223, Part 3 ('Manufacturing of arms by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 1 ('Storage of arms') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. He was sentenced to 12 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 205, Part 2, Point 'a' ('Preparation of a terrorist act to be committed by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 3 ('Storage of arms by an organised group'), Article 223, Part 3 ('Manufacturing of arms by an organised group'), Article 222, Part 1 ('Storage of arms') of the Russian Criminal Code for allegedly plotting a terrorist attack in the Moscow "Kirgizia" cinema as an alleged member of the banned organisation of At-Takfir wa al-Hijra. Mr. Tekilov has been held in custody since 27 November 2013.

Individuals persecuted in connection with the activities of Tablighi Jamaat

- 1. Bakirov, Bekzod Batyrbekovich, was born in 11 January 1981. A resident of the village of Marusino of the Lyubertsy district of Moscow Oblast, he is a Kazakhstani citisen, He is married with two children. He completed secondary education. He was sentenced to 4 years of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony under Article 282.2, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of an extremist organisation') as an alleged member of the banned Islamic movement of Tablighi Jamaat. He has been held in custody since 22 December 2016.
- **2. Dzhumayev, Akhmet Annageldiyevich**, was born on 15 May 1965. A resident of the city of Moscow, he is married with a child. He completed a specialised secondary education. He was sentenced to 4 years of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony under Article 282.2, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of an extremist organisation') as an alleged member of the banned Islamic movement of Tablighi Jamaat. He has been held in custody since 22 December 2016.
- **3.** Kamchybekov, Islambek Ismailbekovich, was born on 9 March 1987. A resident of the city of Moscow, he is a Kyrgyzstani citisen. He is single. He has an incomplete secondary education. He was sentenced to 6 years of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of an extremist organisation') as an alleged member of the banned Islamic movement of Tablighi Jamaat. He has been held in custody since 22 December 2016.
- **4. Kozhamkulov, Shakir Temishevich**, was born on 3 November 1984. A resident of the village of Borschyovo of the Klin district of Moscow Oblast, he is married with two children. He completed secondary education. He was sentenced to 6 years and 6 months of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of an extremist organisation') as an alleged member of the banned Islamic movement of Tablighi Jamaat. He has been held in custody since 22 December 2016.
- **Mustafin, Zufar Rafisovich,** was born on 7 February 1980. A resident of the city of Kazan, he is married with a child. He holds a PhD in Engineering. Prior to his arrest, he was an entrepreneur. He was sentenced to 4 years of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony under Article 282.2, Part 2

- ('Participation in the activities of an extremist organisation') as an alleged member of the banned Islamic movement of Tablighi Jamaat. He has been held in custody since 17 January 2017.
- 6. Suleimanov, Renat Rustemovich, was born in 1969. A resident of the town of Molodyozhny in the Simferopol district of Crimea, he holds a higher education degree. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a tailor. He is married with three children. He was sentenced to 4 years of imprisonment in a general regime penal colony under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of an extremist organisation') as an alleged member of the banned Islamic movement of Tablighi Jamaat. He has been held in custody since 2 October 2017.
- 7. Suyunduuk Uulu, Kanybek, was born on 8 September 1980. A resident of the city of Moscow, he is a Kyrgyzstani citisen. He is married with four children. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a driver. He was sentenced to 6 years and 6 months of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of an extremist organisation') as an alleged member of the banned Islamic movement of Tablighi Jamaat. He has been held in custody since 22 December 2016.
- **8. Usmanov, Airat Rinatovich**, was born on 7 April 1985. A resident of the city of Kazan, he has a higher education degree. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a control instrumentation engineer. He was sentenced to 4 years of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony under Article 282.2, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of an extremist organisation') as an alleged member of the banned Islamic movement of Tablighi Jamaat. He has been held in custody since 17 January 2017.

Individuals persecuted in connection with the activities of Hizb ut-Tahrir al-Işlami

- 1. Abdarakhmanov, Danis Mukhametzarifovich, was born on 27 May 1979. A resident of the town of Kopeisk in Chelyabinsk Oblast, he completed a specialised secondary education. He is married with two children. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a taxi driver. He was sentenced to 6 years of imprisonment in a general-regime penal colony with a fine of 100,000 roubles under Article 205.5, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of an organisation designated as terrorist under Russian law') of the Russian Criminal Code as a member of Hizb ut-Tahrir al-Islami, an organisation banned in Russia that, even according to the prosecution, has never been involved in any violent actions. He has been held in custody since 27 February 2018.
- 2. Abdrakhimov, Ural Ilshatovich, was born on 28 December 1992. A resident of the city of Ufa, he is married with a child. He holds a higher education degree. Prior to his arrest, he worked as a construction planner. He was sentenced to 15 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 205.5, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of an organisation designated as terrorist under Russian law') as a member of Hizb ut-Tahrir allslami, an organisation banned in Russia that, even according to the prosecution, has never been involved in any violent actions. Mr Abdrakhimov has been in custody since 9 February 2017.
- **3.** Abdulganiev, Eskender Izetovich, was born on 16 December 1997. A resident of the town of Oktyabrskoye in the Krasnogvardeiskoye district of Crimea. He is charged with membership of Hizb ut-Tahrir al-Islami, an organisation banned in Russia that, even according to the prosecution, has never been involved in any violent actions, under Article 205.5, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of an organisation designated as terrorist under Russian law') of the Russian Criminal Code. He has been in custody since 14 February 2019.
- **4.** Abdulgaziev, Tofik Sultanovich, was born on 19 June 1981. A resident of the city of Simferopol in Crimea, he is an activist of the movement of 'Crimean Solidarity': he was a sound technician at the 'Crimean Solidarity' and the project of 'Crimean Childhood' and assisted in organizing events for the children of political prisoners and with parcel delivery to political prisoners. He is married with four children. He is charged under Article 205.5, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of an organisation designated as terrorist under Russian law'), Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 278 ('Preparation

- of actions aimed at a violent seizure of power or forcible change of the constitutional order') as a member of Hizb ut-Tahrir al-Islami, an organisation banned in Russia that, even according to the prosecution, has never been involved in any violent actions. He has been in custody since 27 March 2019.
- 5. Abdulkadyrov, Vladlen Vasilyevich, was born on 28 December 1979. A resident of the city of Simferopol in Crimea, he is an activist of the movement of 'Crimean Solidarity': he assisted with parcel delivery to political prisoners. He is married with three children. He is charged under Article 205.5, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of an organisation designated as terrorist under Russian law'), Article 30, Part 1, in conjunction with Article 278 ('Preparation of actions aimed at a violent seizure of power or forcible change of the constitutional order') as a member of Hizb ut-Tahrir al-Islami, an organisation banned in Russia that, even according to the prosecution, has never been involved in any violent actions. He has been in custody since 28 March 2019.
- 6. Abdullayev, Akramzhon Mahmudzhanovich, was born on 8 September 1976. A resident of the city of Sevastopol, he holds the Kyrgyzstani nationality. He was sentenced to 15 years of imprisonment in a strict-regime penal colony under Article 205.5, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of an organisation designated as terrorist under Russian law') and Article 205.1, Part 1 ('Incitement of individuals to terrorist activities') as a member of Hizb ut-Tahrir al-Islami, an organisation banned in Russia that, even according to the prosecution, has never been involved in any violent actions. He has been held in custody since 25 August 2016.

After the release, Mr Kim was taken into the Centre for Temporary Detention of Foreign Nationals in Khabarovsk as after he had been sentenced on extremism charges, the Russian nationality had been revoked from him.

- **4.** Andreyev, Andrei Leonidovich, was born in 1976. A resident of the city of Kursk, he worked as a roofer. He is charged with committing a crime under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held in custody since 16 October 2019.
- **5. Antyukhin, Aleksei Stanislavovich,** was born in 1976. A resident of the city of Voronezh, he worked as a welder. He is charged with committing a crime under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held in custody since 16 October 2019.
- 11. Baibak, Semyon Olegovich, was born in 1997. A resident of the city of Rostov-on-Don, he worked as a Chinese language teacher. He is charged with committing crimes under Article 282.2, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of a banned religious organisation') and Article 282.3, Part 1 ('Financing extremist activities') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held in custody since 10 June 2019.

He is charged with committing crimes under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') and Article 282.2, Part 1.1 ('Recruitment to a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He was detained on 27 May 2020. He has been held in custody since 29 May 2020.

He is charged under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held in custody since 27 August 2020.



- **65.** Skutelets, Gennady Viktorovich, was born in 1976. A resident of the town of Pechora in the Komi Republic, he worked as a street cleaner. He is charged with committing a crime under Article 282.2, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held in custody since 28 January 2020.
- **66. Sokolov, Yevgeny Yuryevich,** was born in 1976. A resident of the city of Voronezh, he is an electrician. He is charged under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held in custody since 13 July 2020.
- **67. Timoshkin, Vladimir Valentinovich,** was born in 1968. A resident of the town of Solikamsk in Perm Krai. He is charged under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He was detained on 28 July 2020. On 30 July 2020 he was placed under house arrest.
- **68. Ukhov, Aleksei Viktorovich,** was born in 1980. A resident of the city of Sovetskaya Gavan in Khabarovsk Krai, he worked as a graphic designer at a local newspaper. . He is charged under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation

- of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held in custody since 22 October 2020.
- **69. Veselov, Mikhail Nikolayevich,** was born in 1968. A resident of the city of Voronezh, he is a construction worker. He is a refugee from the conflict zone in the East of Ukraine. He is charged under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held in custody since 13 July 2020.
- **70.** Vladimirova, Valentina Ivanovna, was born on 1956. A resident of the city of Smolensk. She is charged with committing a crime under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for her membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. She was held in custody from 16 May to 22 November 2019, when she was placed under house arrest.
- **71. Vlasov, Andrei Valeryevich,** was born in 1968. A resident of the town of Prokopyevsk of Kemerovo Oblast, he is a photographer. He is charged under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He was detained on 12 July 2020. On 14 July 2020, he was placed under house arrest.
- **72. Yagupov, Anatoly Gennadyevich,** was born in 1968. A resident of the city of Voronezh, he is a cleaner. He is charged under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He was held in custody from 13 July 2020 to August 2020, when he was placed under house arrest.
- **Yavushkin, Sergei Nikolayevich,** was born in 1960. A resident of the city of Kemerovo, he worked as a welder. He is charged with committing crimes under Article 282.2, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of a banned religious organisation') and Article 282.3, Part 1 ('Financing extremist activities') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held under house arrest since 24 July 2019.
- **74.** Zherebtsov, Konstantin Petrovich, was born in 1973. He is a resident of the town of Chekhov in Moscow Oblast. He is charged with committing a crime under Article 282.2, Part 2 ('Participation in the activities of a banned religious

organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held under house arrest since 3 October 2019.

75. Zhukov, Yevgeny Sergeyevich, was born in 1969. A resident of the city of Sevastopol, he is a construction worker. He is charged under Article 282.2, Part 1 ('Organisation of the activities of a banned religious organisation') for his membership in a community of Jehovah's Witnesses, a religious group banned in Russia. He has been held in custody since 1 October 2020.
